In a recent interview, he expressed his belief that companies with global competitiveness in the environmental sector, much like those in the automotive and semiconductor industries, could emerge in the zone.

The Gangso R&D Specialized Zone is an integrated space for research, residential, industrial, and cultural activities. It is designed to be a self-sufficient, high-density R&D zone centered on key technological institutions such as universities, research institutes, and state-owned enterprises.

The Seo-gu district of Incheon launched the Gangso R&D Specialized Zone in 2022, and Professor Lee has played a key role in its establishment.

Dr. Jong-Tae Park, the president of Incheon National University, has been awarded the 2023 New York Festival Hall of Fame. He was recognized for his contributions to establishing the university as a regional hub, and for his high evaluation of contributions in discovering and creating "shared social values" by preemptively identifying the development agenda of local communities and the nation.

The Korean National Brand Awards are highly respected and prestigious, and are awarded based on the "National Brand Competitiveness Index (NCI)" model developed by the New York Festival. This year, a total of 748 companies and local governments submitted over 1,850 tangible and intangible brand values to calculate the index. After rigorous evaluation, the most valuable and competitive national brands were selected as national assets, and the New York Festivals Hall of Fame inductee was also selected.
